Vehicle Registration Fees

If you haven't received your 2024 vehicle registration application yet, the fee has increased from \$39.00 to \$45.00. I made an inquiry with my State Senator and my State Representative as to why this fee had increased to \$45.00. My State Senator responded that the increase was due to Act 89 and the Consumer Price Index. The larger increase was due to higher inflation. I was also sent a link which takes you to a PDF on PennDot's website that talks about Act 89 and registration fees. If you would like to read about Act 89 further, let me know and I will email the PDF to you. For those who are 65 or older you can get your

vehicle registration for \$10.00. I found a retired persons fact sheet on the DMV website. In order to qualify for the reduced registration fee, your annual income cannot exceed \$19,200.

I also received a phone call from one of my Senators assistants to talk about the reduced rate incase I wasn't aware. I told her that I don't qualify. I also told her that the dollar amount needs to be increased and that this type of program should also be available for surviving spouses under 65.

And as always, my State Rep never answered me.

Pennsylvania Property Tax/Rent Rebates

This program was revised for the 2023 property tax or rent rebates. Widows and Widowers age 50 and older who make \$45,000 or less can apply. The maximum rebate amount was increased by \$375.00 but not everyone will get the extra \$375.00. The age limit used to be widows and widowers 55 and older. This program is also for seniors 65 and older and those with disabilities.

Homeowners and renters will receive a \$1000 rebate if their income is 0—\$8,000. A \$770 rebate if their income is \$8,001—\$15,000. A \$460.00 rebate if their income is \$15,001—\$18,000. A \$380 rebate if their income is \$18,001—\$45,000.

If you haven't received your rebate program booklet in the mail, go to www.revenue.pa.gov to complete your application.

Considering how much we pay in property taxes or rent, I feel these rebates can be more. This was the first increase in this program in nearly two decades. Why did it take so long to increase the rebate amounts?

In my opinion, they could have done better by giving each level of those incomes that additional \$375.00.

share. Everyone seemed to have a photo or two that the rest of us didn't have, so I went hunting for those pictures and created this beautiful book "All about Mom"




If you haven't done so already, consider creating a book on a family member or a pet in their memory. Let me know if you need any help.
